4. College profile

Govt. Hamidia Arts & Commerce College Bhopal was established in 1946 by Nawab Hamidullah Khan, ruler of erstwhile Bhopal state. Its first premises was iconic Minto Hall. When the new state of Madhya Pradesh was formed on November 1, 1956, Minto Hall was transformed into legislative house. Hamidia College, Bhopal was relocated to a new campus near Govt. Polytechnic College. In 2005 it was again shifted to then govt. MLB Girls College Campus situated in Hathikhana, Budhwara Bhopal.

Post-Graduation in Political Science was started in 1952. Since then the college has flourished in leaps and bounds and now it is offering PG in 12 Subjects of Arts faculty as well as M.Com in Commerce faculty. The college has also been upgraded to a research center in many subjects and its faculty is busy in guiding hundreds of

research scholars in their pursuit of Ph.D degrees. The college has been elevated to research center status in arts, languages, social sciences and commerce stream for Ph.D and D.Litt. Research scholars from all over India are doing their research work under the able supervision of faculty in a congenial atmosphere.

The college is proud of its rich library. Its old and new books collection is unparalleled. The library has a number of old manuscripts in many languages like Hindi, Urdu, Arabic, Sanskrit, Persian and English. Moreover, all departments have their own well organized and maintained departmental libraries.

Its Golden Jubilee was celebrated in 1996 and it was attended the then President of India and its alumni Dr. Shankar Dayal Sharma. Papers includes general Hindi, general English thought by the Hindi and English department and third paper Environmental study thought by the Geography department and enterpriniourship development classes taken by the Economics department. Third paper of foundation course in UG final year computer application thought by the computer teacher. Thus the all papers of foundation course in B.Com, classes taken by above written departments.

5. Annual/semester/choice based credit system(programme wise):

Since 2015-16 for all UG classes B.Com, BCA,BBA,B.Com (Computer) semester systems applied and no credit base valuation system applied in UG classes during these periods. Since 2017-18 in all UG classes annual examination pattern applying, no credit

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base valuation system applied.

Since 2015-16 in PG classes M.Com, applying semesters system continuously in PG classes. But no credit base system not applying. Our college working under Barkatullah University and all decisions about courses and examination pattern taken by the University board of study, commerce.

6. Participation of the department in the courses offered by other departments:

Department of Commerce conducting, coordinating all self-financing courses running in the college all classes of self-financing courses like BCA, BBA, B.Com Honors, B.Com Computer application directing, coordinating and managing by the department. Time table making, admission work, internal examination, class coordination, practical examination, project work, guest lectures, training programs, placement, extension activities, ad-on courses also arranged by the department of commerce along with their traditional courses B.Com and M.Com. All traditional and vocational courses running successfully.

7. Courses in collaboration with other universities, industries, foreign institutions, etc:

Our parent university Barkatullah Vishwavidyalaya Bhopal collaborated with other university for practical examination, Internship project assessment, main examination paper setting, and valuation of Answer books for all UG and PG classes, preparation of result and declaration of result. Department also arranged job oriented career opportunities related lectures, training and workshop with inviting motivational gurus and various subject experts from the various industries and institutions. Department of commerce also organized national level training programs, workshop and lectures series for career awareness of our students time to time. Department organized 90 hours training during 11 to 16 June 2019 for 60 commerce students of B.Com. Final year. They benefited from National level training with the collaboration by NEF (National Education Foundation) and NSDC (National Skill development council) under policy of technical and higher education department of M.P. government. 2nd training program organized during 2 to 13 march 2020 for 25 commerce student with collaboration of MSME Department Bhopal for Career awareness. 22 Students benefited by this training & got certificate by the MSME department New Delhi after Successfully completion of training. They can use the certificate as experience certificate while they are applying in related field.

Overall Observations of the committee:

We inspected each faculty, their departments, library and sports department. After visiting and interacted with staff and supporting staff the committee gathered and analysed facts and informations. The pointwise findings of committee are as follows:

1. The number of courses being run in the college are adequate but employment oriented programs are lacking
2. All the professors/ Associate Professors/ Assistant Professors are well qualified.
3. There are sufficient facilities for teaching & learning available in the department. But number of smart classrooms is less.
4. The academic and research achievements of all the departments are commendable.
5. There is departmental library in each post graduate department but the number of books for students is less.
6. The facilities in the library are inadequate due to the lack of space. However, this problem will be rectified as new library building is under construction.
7. Furniture is comparatively inadequate, in proportion to the number of students.
8. Seminar halls and conference rooms to conduct academic and co-curricular activities are adequate.
9. Commerce is a faculty but it is run as a department in the college. It will be more beneficial for the students if it is run as a faculty.
10. Adequate facilities for indoor/ outdoor games and sports are available. The students from our college are selected at national level competitions in good numbers every year.

7. Strength and opportunities for improvement

The audit committee is satisfied with the inherent strength of the college some of them are mentioned below

- Our institute is the oldest and most prestigious college of Bhopal. One of the greatest strengths of the institute is the immense diversity of talents. Our college has been able to attract students not only from Madhya Pradesh but from other parts of the country.
- Holistic development of the students is fostered through soft skills, communication skills, ICT and Life skill programs. Practice of Yoga and Meditation help to improve the physical and mental wellbeing of the students as a result of which they have performed brilliantly in academics and co-curricular activities. Their achievements have been brilliant in sports and cultural activities. Participation of students in the decision making process is ensured. They are made members of various committees.
- The alumni who have made a distinct mark in national and international spheres significantly contribute to their alma mater in myriad ways.
- The institute has taken some trail blazing outreach initiatives. The college excels in altruism, extension activities and nation building endeavors.
- The college has experienced, highly qualified, assiduous and dedicated faculty members. Most of them have PhD and are Research guides. The college is a recognized Ph.D. center. More than 100 Ph.Ds have been awarded in the last five years. Well qualified and experienced teaching faculty is one of the greatest strength of the College. More than 50% teaching faculty is resource person and subject expert at State and National level.
- Responsive, effective and efficient administration is also one of the greatest strengths of the institute.
- Sensitization of students towards social responsibility is reflected in the significant achievement made by them in this sphere. The N.S.S. unit of our institute has won a number of accolades and awards. The accomplishments and achievement of N.S.S. are outstanding.
- The institute has a lush green campus endowed with rich flora and fauna. RUSA fund of 02 crores has been utilized for new construction, renovation and supporting infrastructure.

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- Inclusive approach to education by expanding the educational facilities and services of the College to comparatively less served areas and economically weak sections.
- In general the overall feeling of satisfaction on the part of stakeholders is a valuable strength of College.

Opportunities

- The college can be developed into a vibrant Research and innovation center. The students can be oriented for Research. The Fine Arts department has made a distinct mark in academic and co-curricular activities. The college has ample potential to be a center for augmenting innovation and creativity.
- The college can enhance Information Technology Resources by making optimum use of NRC. The college can further exploit the alumni who are in key positions in government and private sectors for enhancing learning resources.
- More MOUs could be signed to expose the students to the competitive world.
