## **RESEARCH POLICY**

### **GOVT. HAMIDIA ARTS AND COMMERCE COLLEGE**

Academic institutions are expected to perform various activities out of which teaching, research and extension are of paramount importance. Research happens to be one of the pioneer aspects of academic activities which help the institution to achieve excellence in the field of education. Research and developmental activities help to create new avenues in knowledge, promote innovation and this will motivate better learning and teaching among faculties and students of Govt. Hamidia Arts and Commerce College, Bhopal. Research is the foundation of knowledge that brings new energy, builds state-of-the-art facilities, promotes research publications, develops collaborations and becomes part of an active community that shares the mission objectives. Taking these into consideration, Govt. Hamidia Arts and Commerce College, Bhopal framed and implemented its Research Policy.

#### **Purpose:**

The purpose of the Research Policy is to create a vibrant atmosphere of research among faculty and inculcate research aptitude among the students. It also aims to identify thrust areas of research having social relevance and thereby supplementing the Vision and mission of the college. The Research policy also emphasises contribution towards society and to the nation at large.

#### **Scope:**

This Research Policy forms the basics of the research ethics of the college and is implemented in all the departments and it serves as the guidelines for the functioning of the Research council of the college.

#### **Custodian of the Policy:**

The Research Policy shall have a Research Advisory Cell which functions under the Principal, to assist and advise in matters related to research within the college. It also includes the convenor of the research committee, two senior professors and research scholars.

## **Objectives of Research Policy:**

The Principal objectives of the Research Policy are as follows:

1. To develop awareness regarding research in the faculty and students.
2. To establish a research culture through various research initiatives and programs.
3. To establish Research Center in different disciplines with emphasis on socially relevant topics.
4. To encourage faculty members to publish research papers and undertake various research projects of social and academic importance.
5. The college shall have a well-defined research quality which shall act as a guideline for the scholar, teachers and all other concerned personnel.
6. To encourage original quality basic and applied research in the fields literature commerce and all related and other relevant fields.
7. To identify the emerging areas of research and encourage the faculty members to undertake research in these areas.
8. To establish linkage with industries and business organizations to identify potential areas of research, surveys and other basic research enquiry.
9. To acquire projects, market surveys and other research activities to acquire assistance from other business houses, industries, NGOs, boards and forums.
10. To encourage faculty members to get research projects from National Funding agencies like SERB, DBT, DST, ICSSR, UGC and other such institutions.
11. To identify faculty members who can work as leaders in the field of research and encourage them to undertake research projects, studies and surveys.
12. To provide financial assistance for publication of research papers and research findings.
13. To offer a suitable platform to the faculty members, scholars and students of Govt. Hamidia Arts and Commerce College, Bhopal to publish their research findings and encourage them to bring to the notice of society issues of contemporary importance.
14. To organize various workshops to develop appropriate research skills among the scholars and faculty members.

15. To depute faculty members to various workshops, symposia, seminars and conferences in their respective fields as well as in areas of contemporary importance.
16. To establish suitable infrastructure in the college that will help to undertake different research projects.
17. To enrich information and data resources suitable for undertaking quality research projects and enquires.

## ORDINANCE 14

### DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY

1. A candidate for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy must, at the time of application, hold Master's degree with atleast 55% marks or an equivalent grade of M. Phil. degree of the University a deemed University or any other University incorporated by any law for the time being in force and recognised by the University.

Provided that a candidate who has atleast 7 years experience of research/teaching with atleast 5 papers published in standard research journal, may be permitted to get registered for Ph. D. degree, even if he does not possess 55% marks at masters degree.

2. A candidate must apply for registration for Ph. D. degree of his subject on the prescribed form obtainable on payment of prescribed fee stating,

- (a) his qualification and experience;
- (b) subject in which he proposes to work;
- (c) the field or topic of Research Work;
- (d) name of the supervisor (along with the name of Co-supervisors, if any) under whom he wishes to work and the place/places at which he/she wishes to carry on investigations together with the consent of the Supervisor and Co-supervisors, if any.

The application must also be accompanied with :

- (a) Registration fee of Rs. 400.00
- (b) A Certificate from the Head of the University Teaching Department/School of Studies or the Principal of the college affiliated to the University or Head of a Research Institute recognised for the purpose by the University testifying that adequate facilities exist and stating that the Head of the University Teaching Department/School of Studies or the Principal or the Head of the Research Institute will, in case the candidate is permitted, allow the candidate to work in his department or college or institution under the supervision of the person/s mentioned in the application.
- (c) Attested copies of the marksheet/gradesheet of Master's degree examination and M. Phil. degree examination. Eligibility and migration certificates wherever necessary should be enclosed to the application. Application for registration may be submitted any time during the academic year,
- (d) A certificate from the Head of the institution where he wishes to prosecute his research work, that he has paid the following first instalment fees be enclosed :
  - (i) Tuition fee (Rs. 300/- for Six month)
  - (ii) Library fee (Rs. 120/- for Six month)
  - (iii) Library caution money As per provisions of the institution.
  - (iv) Identity card Rs. 10.00 once only
  - (v) Laboratory Rs. 240/- for six month (for research Scholars where laboratory work is involved).
  - (vi) Laboratory caution money Rs. 100.00 once only and refundable.
- (e) A certificate from the University Library that he has paid the Library fee along with caution money as follows be also enclosed :
  - (i) Library fee (Rs. 120/- for six months)
  - (ii) Library caution money Rs. 250/- once only and refundable.

Provided that the teachers of the University and teachers under the U.G.C.'s scheme of teacher fellowship will not be required to pay the fees as in para 2-d.

(f) After payment of fees along with the form of application the candidate will be provisionally admitted. Provided that the application is found in order on being scrutinized by a Dean of faculty appointed by the Kulpati.

3. After six months of his application, the candidate shall be eligible to submit a synopsis (as per Appendix-1) of his proposed research work along with the title of thesis (in seven copies) duly forwarded by the supervisor and Head of the Institution where the candidate is working. He shall be required to make an oral presentation of the proposed work before the Research Degree Committee consisting of the following members :

- (i) Kulpati or his nominee.
- (ii) Dean of the Faculty.
- (iii) Head of the University Teaching Department/School of Studies in the subject.
- (iv) Chairman, Board of Studies in the subject.
- (v) One external subject expert of the rank of University Professor to be appointed by the Kulpati, ordinarily out of a panel of 5 experts given by the Chairman of the Board of Studies concerned. The term of panel shall be conterminus with the Chairman Board of Studies.

External expert and two other members shall form the quorum.

Note : 1. On the request of the supervisor Kulpati may permit him to be present as an observer during the oral presentation of his candidate.

2. No. T. A. and D. A. shall be payable to the candidate and the supervisor for attending the Research Degree Committee meeting.

4. The meeting of the Research Degree Committee shall be held in the University Office twice a year preferably in February and October. The committee shall recommend the eligibility of the person for the appointment as Supervisor, Co-Supervisor. The committee shall also prepare a list of approved Supervisors/Co-supervisors along with their specializations as per provisions of this Ordinance. This list shall be available with the Registrar.

The committee shall recommend suitability of the topic of research and the registration of the candidate for the Ph. D. degree. On approval by the RDC the candidate shall be registered and enrolled as a student from the date the Head of the Department/School of Studies/College/Institution forwarded the application or the date on which the candidate deposits the registration fee, whichever is later. He will also be required to pay regular tuition, library and laboratory fees (six monthly) during his research tenure.

Provided that if the RDC does not recommend a candidate for registration to Ph. D. Degree, the caution money deposited by the candidate shall be refunded.

5. A candidate shall ordinarily be permitted to work for Ph. D. Degree in the subject in which he/she has obtained his Master's Degree.

Provided that research work leading to Ph. D. Degree may be allowed in allied subjects of interdisciplinary nature of the same faculty or of allied faculties. In such cases the candidate may also be permitted to work under one or two Co-supervisors, along with the supervisor.

6. A candidate shall pursue his research at the institution from where his/her application form has been forwarded under section 2(b) of the Ordinance.

Provided that a candidate permitted to work in a research establishment recognised by the University shall be required to take atleast one Co-supervisor along with the Supervisor: one of them should be the teacher of the University and the other a Teacher/Scientist/Scholar/Director of the Institution where the candidate is actually working.

Provided also a candidate may be permitted to carry out his practical work in a Research Institution/Research laboratory/Laboratory of a University recognised by the University for the purpose, under the supervision of Scientist/Director/Teacher of the Institution who may or may not be the Co-supervisor of the candidate.

7. (a) The person recommended as Supervisor/Co-supervisor to guide the Research Scholar must be :

(i) A Professor/Reader in a University Teaching Department/School of Studies or a College affiliated to the University possessing either Doctorate degree or has published five research papers in Standard Research Journals.

OR

(ii) A teacher of a University Teaching Department/School of Studies/College affiliated to the University who has obtained a Doctorate degree in the subject and has published atleast five Research Journals and has atleast five year teaching experience after Ph.D.

(iii) (a) A Scientist/Scholar/Director working in a research institute/organization/establishment/laboratory, recognised by the University as a research centre, who has obtained a doctorate degree and published 5 research papers on concerned subject in standard research journal and has 5 years post-doctoral research experience.

(b) The person recommended as Co-supervisor to guide Research Scholar, together with Supervisor must be :

A Teacher/Scientist/Director of any University/Research Establishment who has obtained a Doctorate degree, and has published atleast five research papers in standard Research Journals with 5 year Post-doctoral research experience.

(c) A recognised supervisor who fails to publish any research paper over a duration of five years shall not be eligible to enroll any new candidate under his supervision. Provided that the persons who have been recognised as Supervisors/Co-supervisors shall be eligible to supervise even after their superannuation.

Provided also that the teacher who has been recognised as Supervisor/Co-supervisor under the repealed ordinance shall continue to be recognised as Supervisor/co-supervisor. Provided further that a person who is himself registered for Ph.D. degree of any University shall not be eligible to act as Supervisor/Co-supervisor or member of any committee mentioned in this Ordinance.

8. (a) The candidate shall pursue his research at the approved place of research under the supervisor/Co-supervisor on the approved subject. The candidate shall be permitted to submit his/her thesis not earlier than 24 months and not later than four calendar years from the date of registration. In case a candidate does not submit his/her thesis within four calendar years, from the date of registration and does not apply for extension in time his/her registration shall stand automatically cancelled.

Provided that the period for submission of thesis can be extended by one year by the Kulpati, if he/she applies for extension atleast one month before the expiry of registration period together with a fee of Rs. 300/-. In case the candidate does not submit his/her thesis within the extended period, his/her registration shall stand automatically cancelled.

Provided also that Kulpati may permit a candidate to get registered on the same topic on payment of a reregistration fee of Rs. 500.00. The minimum period of 24 months and attendance shall not apply to such reregistered candidate.

(b) The candidate possessing M. Phil. degree or a teacher with 5 years teaching experience at the time of registration can submit his/her thesis after 18 months instead of 24 months as provided in section 8 (a) of the Ordinance.

(c) The candidate shall put in atleast 200 days attendance in the institution concerned or with the Supervisor.

9. The candidate may be allowed to change the Supervisor by the Kulpati, on the recommendation of the committee constituted by the Kulpati for this purpose under special circumstances. No major change in the topic of research will be permitted due to change in supervisor.

10. The University shall obtain every six months a record of attendance, receipt of fees paid and a progress report of the work of the Research Scholar from his Supervisor as per Appendix-2. If the progress of work is not found satisfactory in two successive report or no reports are received for a period of one year and the candidate fails to deposit fees the Kulpati may order the removal of the name of the Scholar from the list of those registered for the Ph.D. degree

11. (a) The candidate shall submit six copies of the summary of the thesis together with a list of research papers published communicated for publication, if any, through his Supervisor to the Registrar about three months prior to the anticipated date of submission of thesis.

(b) The supervisor shall submit a panel of atleast six names of examiners actively engaged in the concerned area of research not below the rank of Reader or college Professor in a sealed cover to the Registrar. Provided that the panel of examiners shall be obtained from the Head, University Teaching Department/School of Studies/Chairman, Board of Studies of the subject concerned, in case the candidate is related\* to the Supervisor.

(c) On the receipt of the panel of examiners from the Supervisor and summary from the candidate, the Registrar shall call a meeting of Examination Committee of the subject constituted U/S 44 of the Adhiniyam. The committee considering the panel submitted by the Supervisor/Head, University Teaching Department/School of Studies/Chairman, Board of Studies, prepare a panel of six names to act as examiners.

(d) The Kulpati shall appoint out of the panels submitted by the Supervisor and Examination Committee respectively, two examiners as per provisions of section 44 of the Adhiniyam. The consent of examiners shall be obtained by sending them the summary and list of publications, if any.

Note : Supervisor / Head of the Department/Chairman, Board of Studies as well as Examination Committee can recommend the name(s) of Foreign examiners. In case a Foreign examiner is appointed by the Kulpati and the candidate wishes the thesis to be sent by AIR MAIL he/she shall have to bear the charges of AIR MAIL.

\*The term relations shall include : Father, mother, wife, husband, daughter, son, grand son, grand daughter, brother, sister, nephew, niece, grand nephew/niece, uncle, aunt, son-in-law, sister-in-law, father-in-law, mother-in-law, first cousin-in-law etc.



12. The candidate shall supply three type written/photocopies hardbound of his thesis along with the following :

(a) The candidate shall try as far as possible to publish/communicate paper(s) for publication in Standard Research Journals. Published/communicated paper(s) be appended.

(b) The thesis must be accompanied by a declaration from the candidate that the thesis embodies his own work and he/she has worked under the Supervisor at the approved place of work for the required period as per provisions of para 8 of the Ordinance. (Appendix-3)

(c) The certificate from the Supervisor together with Co-supervisors, if any, that the thesis fulfills the requirements of the Ordinance relating to the Ph.D. degree of the University. (Appendix-4)

(d) The candidate shall also remit with the thesis Rs. 500/- (Rupees Five hundred) as the examination fee.

13. On receipt of the thesis along with the certificates and fee it shall be sent to the examiners already consented as per para II of the Ordinance.

14. The thesis to be accepted for the award of the Ph.D. degree must comply with the following conditions :

(a) It must be a piece of research work characterised either by the discovery of the facts or by a fresh approach towards the interpretation of facts. In either case it should evince the candidate's capacity for critical examination and sound judgement.

(b) It must be satisfactory in point of language and presentation of the subject matter.

15. The examiners shall categorically recommend in the prescribed proforma (Appendix-5) acceptance, revision or rejection of the thesis together with detailed comments on the points spelled out in clause 14 of the Ordinance. The examiner must also give a list of the questions he wishes to be asked at the viva-voce examination.

16 (a) The examiners may seek clarification of the subject matter of the thesis from the Supervisor. The provision will be incorporated in the letter to be sent to the examiners while sending the thesis.

(b) The Kulpati can recall the thesis from an examiner who fails to send the report within three months of the date of despatch of the thesis and appoint another examiner.

17 (a) In case both the examiners reject the thesis or one of them rejects the thesis and the other recommends a revision—the thesis shall be rejected.

(b) If both the examiners recommend for the revision of the thesis, the candidate shall be called upon to revise the thesis in the light of the observations of examiners.

(c) If one examiner approves the thesis and the other rejects it or recommends for revision the thesis shall be sent to the third examiner drawn from the panel of examiners by the Kulpati without the reports of earlier examiners. The third examiner shall be asked to give his/her opinion and this opinion shall be final.

(d) In case both the original examiners accept the thesis for the award of the Ph. D. Degree or in the event of it being referred to the third examiner, the third examiner accepts the thesis for the award of the Ph. D. Degree, the candidate shall be called upon to appear at the viva-voce examination before a board of examiners comprising of the Supervisor, Co-supervisor (if any) and one of the two examiners (selected by the Kulpati) who have accepted the thesis for the award of the Ph. D. degree. Provided that the Kulpati shall appoint Head, Department/School of Studies or Chairman, Board of Studies of the subject concerned to act as viva-voce examiner, in place of the Supervisor in case the candidate is related to the Supervisor.

(e) The Supervisor, Head, University Teaching Department/School of Studies, Chairman, Board of Studies of the subject concerned, as the case may be, shall be communicated the name of the external examiner appointed by Kulpati to conduct the viva-voce examination. The date fixed for the viva-voce be informed to the candidate and the Registrar.

Provided that (looking to the) in special circumstances Kulpati may appoint alternate viva-voce examiner if both the examiners are not in a position to conduct the viva-voce examination.

(f) The viva-voce examination shall be conducted at the University Teaching Department/School of Studies in the subject or at any place fixed by the University for the purpose. The date, time and place of viva-voce examination shall be notified by the Registrar on the University Notice Board atleast a week in advance. At the time of viva-voce examination the board of examiners shall be provided the reports of the examiners which shall be returned along with the report of viva-voce examination to the Registrar.

(g) The candidate shall present the work embodied in the thesis before the board of examiners, members of faculty, research scholars and other interested persons. After the presentation of the research work the Board shall ask question together with those questions which have been given along with examiners reports. Others in the audience can also ask questions and the candidate shall reply only those questions which are permitted by the external examiner.

(h) In case the recommendation of the viva-voce examiners differ from that of the thesis examiner or there is difference of opinion between the viva-voce examiners, the candidate shall reappear at a second viva-voce examination within six-months. If the candidate fails to satisfy the viva-voce examiners a second time, his/her thesis shall be finally rejected.

Such candidates would be required to pay an additional fee of Rs. 200.00 for second viva-voce. The external examiner for second viva-voce shall be appointed by the Kuipati.

18. If the examiners recommend that the candidate be asked to revise improve his thesis, the Kuipati shall permit the candidate to resubmit his thesis not earlier than six months and not later than eighteen months, the period being counted from the date of the issue of order to the candidate. The candidate shall be provided examiner(s) reports without disclosing the names of the examiners to enable him/her to improve the thesis. All the copies of the thesis shall also be returned to the candidate.

In case the candidate is allowed to resubmit the thesis he/she will have to pay a fee of Rs. 500.00 afresh at the time of resubmission, but it shall not be necessary for him to reproduce any certificate of further attendance at the institution at which he/she carried out the work.

The resubmitted three copies of the thesis must make clear mention that it is a revised version.

The thesis shall be got examined as far as possible by the examiners who finally recommended for the revision.

In case both the examiners of revised thesis accept the thesis for the award then the candidate shall be awarded the Ph. D. degree on successful viva-voce examination as per provisions of clause 17 of the Ordinance.

In case a candidate is asked to revise the thesis under clause 17(b) and one of the examiners recommends again for revision and the other accepts the thesis for award then the thesis shall be sent to the third examiner. If the third examiner rejects or recommends for revision the thesis shall stand rejected. If, he accepts for the award then the candidate shall be awarded the Ph. D. degree on successful viva-voce examination as per provision of clause 17 of the Ordinance.

In case a candidate who has been asked to revise the thesis under clause 17(c) and one of the examiners recommends again for revision and the other accepts the thesis for award then the candidate shall be awarded the Ph. D. degree on successful viva-voce examination as per provision of clause 17 of the Ordinance.

If the revised thesis is required to be revised a second time it shall automatically stand rejected.

19. Maximum number of research candidates that can be registered and allowed to pursue research work under a supervisor at any particular time shall be six only.

Provided that the candidates registered with the co-supervisor shall not be counted for the number of candidates under a supervisor.

20. No research scholar shall join any other course study or appear at any other examination conducted by any University leading to a degree (except Certificate/Diploma Course of Languages, Research methodology, Statistics, Computer courses).

21. The thesis shall be published only with the permission of the University and such publication shall state on the title page itself that this was a thesis approved for the award of the Ph.D. degree of the University.

22. After the viva-voce, the recommendation of the examiners shall be reported to the Executive Council for the award of Ph.D. degree to the candidate. One copy of the thesis will be kept in the University Library and another copy will be kept in the Departmental Library of the Institution where the research work was carried out; the third will be returned to the supervisor.

23. After the declaration of the result the successful candidates may be provided the copies of reports of examiners who recommended for the award of the degree on payment of fee of Rs. 100/-. The reports will not be disclose the identity of the examiners.

24. The candidates who have been already registration for Ph.D. degree under the repealed Ordinance will continue to be governed by the provisions of repealed Ordinance.

The candidates who have applied for registration but have not been registered till this Ordinance comes into force shall be governed by the the provisions of this Ordinance.

25. On detection of any irregularity, the University shall take suitable steps to withdraw the degree as per provisions of Section 6 (12) of the Adhiniyam.

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## UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION

### 12<sup>th</sup> PLAN GUIDELINES FOR PROVIDING GRANTS TO UNIVERSITY/COLLEGE TEACHERS FOR MINOR RESEARCH PROJECT

#### 1. INTRODUCTION & OBJECTIVES

The major number of researchers in all streams work as teachers in the universities and colleges. Hence, UGC provides financial support to meet their requirements for individual and excellent research in specialized areas.

#### 2. ELIGIBILITY/TARGET GROUP:

The University Grants Commission will provide financial assistance to Universities and Colleges (Under Section 2(f) and 12 B of UGC Act, 1956 only) permanent/regular, working teachers preferably Assistant Professors (Lecturers) who wish to undertake, along with teaching work, a Minor Research Project or working for doctorate degree under an approved supervisor.

The permanent teachers working in self financing Institutions [Self financing colleges subject to fulfilment of conditions stipulated in the UGC (Fitness of Institution for grant Rules, 1975) and subject to the condition that fees charged by such colleges are in accordance with the State/University fee regulations or as laid down by any law in force also eligible to apply under the scheme.

A working teacher can avail only one project/ scheme of the UGC at any given time. The one, which is offered and accepted first irrespective of Principal Investigator must be completed before the other offer is accepted. **Failure to abide by this rule shall make the Principal Investigator and the Institution liable to refund the entire amount paid by the UGC in all such schemes. They may be also debarred from participation in future UGC programmes.** It would be the responsibility of the Principal Investigator and the host Institution for total accountability of the project. After completion of one project (date of finalization of accounts of the project). **If a teacher desires to undertake another UGC project, a gap of one year will be necessary.** The Principal Investigator should publish two papers in a reputed journal in the form of Books/Article/Presentation in seminar etc. from the said project completed.

**Only the teaching faculty of Library Science, Physical Education will also be eligible to participate in the scheme.**

**Colleges/Universities/ Institutions forwarding the proposal should have adequate research facilities.**

### **3. NATURE OF ASSISTANCE:**

The quantum of assistance for a research project will be as under:

**Minor Research Project in Sciences including Engineering & Technology, Medical, Pharmacy Agriculture etc. - Rs. 5.00 lacs.**

**Minor Research Project in Humanities, Social Science, Languages, Literature, Arts, Law and allied disciplines - Rs. 3.00 lacs.**

#### **Non-Recurring Grants**

##### **a. Equipment (Minor equipments only)**

##### **b. Books and Journals**

The equipment as well as books & journals grants may be utilized to procure the essential equipments and books & journals needed for the proposed research work.

The equipments and books & journals acquired by the Principal Investigator under a Minor Research Project must be deposited to University/ College/Institution or in the departmental library or the central library after the completion of the project which will be the institutional property.

#### **Recurring Grant**

##### **(a) Hiring Services**

This is meant for specialized technical work, such as sample analysis, for which the University/Institution either has no infrastructure or such services are available on payment basis.

##### **(b) Contingency**

The admissible contingency grant may be utilized on spares for apparatus, photo-stat copies and microfilms, typing, stationary, postage, telephone calls, internet, fax, computation and printing needed for the project. Expenditure towards the audit fee may also be claimed under contingency head.

**(c)Special Needs** : Assistance may be provided for any other special requirement in connection with the project which is not covered under any other 'Head' of assistance under the scheme.

##### **(d) Chemicals and Consumables**

To meet expenditure on chemicals, glassware and other consumable items.



#### **(e) Travel and Field Work**

The amount allocated under the head travel/field work is to be utilized for data collection and collection of other information such as documents and visit to libraries within the general scope and sphere of the ongoing project. This should not be used for attending conferences, seminars, workshops and training courses etc. They may also avail special casual leave/duty leave for field work/collection of data as per University rules.

#### **(f) Re-Appropriation**

The Principal Investigator may re-appropriate maximum 20 per cent of the **recurring** grant allocated under each head with the permission of Registrar/Principal under intimation to the UGC with the justifications.

#### **(g) Tenure and Implementation**

##### **Two years.**

**The effective date of implementation of the project will be mentioned in approval-cum-sanction letter.**

#### **4. PROCEDURE FOR APPLYING**

All eligible teachers in colleges may submit their Minor Research Proposal applications from 1<sup>st</sup> April to 31<sup>st</sup> July in the prescribed proforma to the concerned **Regional Offices of UGC** located at **Bhopal, Kolkata, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Bangalore and Pune**. The teachers from the colleges in the Northern Region including Delhi may apply to the **UGC Northern Region Colleges Bureau (NRCB) at 35, Feroze Shah Road, New Delhi – 110 001**. Before submission, the concerned institute should get the proposal assessed by their Research bodies with a certificate that the proposed research work is in conformity with the Minor Research Project guidelines.

**The Minor Projects of the University teachers will be dealt by the concerned University out of the development grants.**

#### **5. PROCEDURE FOR APPROVAL**

The received proposals duly forwarded by the Colleges will be assessed with the help of a subject expert committee constituted by the UGC at concerned Regional Offices. The final decision will be taken by the UGC on the basis of recommendations made by the Committee and the availability of funds under the scheme.

**The Universities should also comply with these guidelines in case of Minor Research Projects.**

#### **6. PROCEDURE FOR RELEASE OF GRANTS**

The first instalment of the grant shall comprise of 100% of the Non – Recurring and 50% of the

total Recurring grant approved by the Commission for the total duration of the project. The grant will be released to the Principal of the College.

On receipt of Annual Progress Report, statement of expenditure and utilization certificate of 1<sup>st</sup> instalment of grant, the 40% of the total recurring grant will be released as second instalment. Remaining 10% will be released on receipt of following completion documents as final reimbursement:

1. copy of the final report of project along with soft copy.
2. A consolidated itemwise detailed statement of expenditure incurred during the complete project period in the prescribed proforma duly signed and sealed by the Principal and the Principal Investigator
3. A consolidated Audited Utilization Certificate for the amount actually utilized towards the project duly signed and sealed by Govt. Internal Auditor/ Chartered Accountant, Principal as well as the Principal Investigator in the prescribed proforma.
4. The unutilized grant if any, may be refunded immediately through demand draft drawn in favour of the Joint Secretary of the concerned Regional Offices of UGC.

**It is mandatory to post the Executive summary of the report, Research documents, monograph, academic papers published under Minor Research Project on the website of the University/College.**

The Principal Investigators/Institutions are expected to settle the accounts immediately on completion of the project. In case the balance grant, if any, is not claimed within **six months from the date of completion of the project, the same will lapse and no representation will be entertained on this behalf.**

## **7. GENERAL**

a) After finalisation of the selection procedure of the Minor Research projects the names of the selected PIs will be posted on the UGC website. The PIs should check their names and send their acceptance certificate duly forwarded by the Principal of the institutions immediately to the concerned Regional Offices to enable the UGC to send the approval/sanction letters.

(b) Project is not transferable in any case.

c) If the PI is transferred from his/her original place of work to another Institution (under Section 2 (f) and 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956 ) No Objection Certificate should be furnished for the transfer of the project from both the Institutions stating that necessary facilities will be provided by the Institution in which the awardee is transferred for the smooth functioning of the project.

**d) If a Principal Investigator fails to complete the project, he/she has to refund the entire amount released with interest.**

e) No extension in tenure is permissible in any circumstances.

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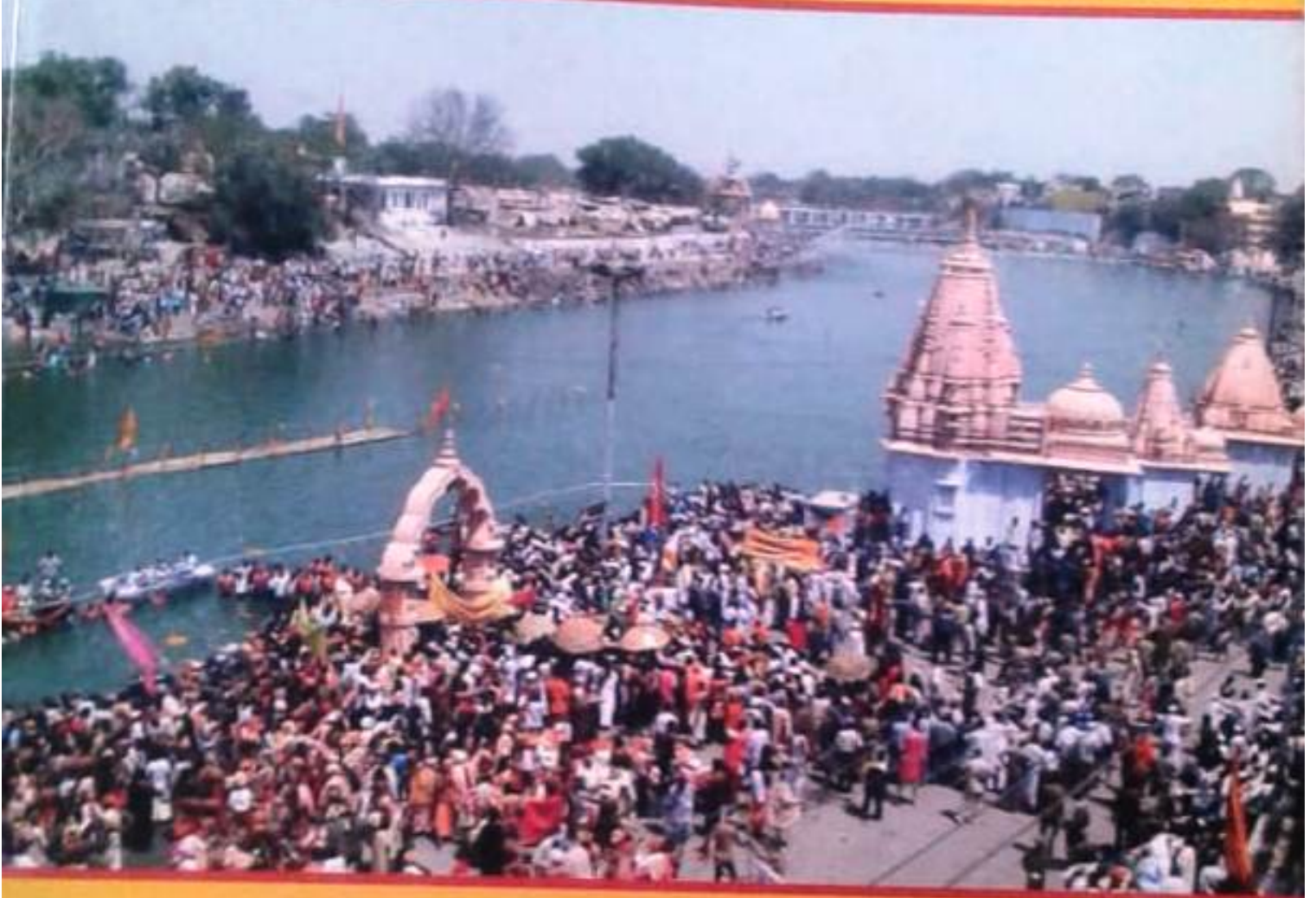
